Purpose of meeting

 - Do you think that the approach will take us where we need to get to in terms of the visualisation outcomes? *[see images]* i.e. are the proposals/ cNRAs ambitious enough, or not achievable?
 - In each of the 12 NRAs identified, where is the greatest potential (e.g. boundaries, in-field habitat options, soils/ land management), where we can deliver most effectively and therefore should be the focus for investment? What opportunities are missing e.g. other known areas of significance, keen landowners










Blackdown Hills AONB - Current landscape







Blackdown Hills AONB – Visualisation Woodland and hedge network
