ITEM 3 Presentations	
Nature Connections	VDH
Vanessa introduced the Nature Connections Network and explained the massive impact they are having across the Blackdown Hills. In particular green prescribing and how this is having a massive impact and potentially saving the NHS a large amount of money.

Nature Calling	CG
Clare introduced the project and explained that there was a total budget of £8,000 which was made up with £2,000 from BHNL, £2,000 EDNL and the rest from Nature Calling. Working alongside EDNL made the project more adaptable.	
BN commented that the work on the website is looking great, in particular the OS of walks and rides.

The Yarty – river restoration works & project updates	нм
Hannah showed a number of slides, showing the huge amounts of work that have been on-going on The Yarty and described a number of other projects that she is currently working on. Discussions continued about Himalayan Balsam and DNW asked if there are still volunteer groups which work on areas to clear it. CD commented that there are lots of individual groups doing it but it needs to be co-ordinated.	
Devon Local Nature Recovery strategy (LNRS)	SJ
Sarah explained that the Devon consultation has actually ended but they are keeping it open until Monday 10 th November, Somerset's consultation ends on Friday 7 th November.

Discussions continued regarding the fact that Devon's strategy may take longer to sign off because of the number of local authorities within Devon. NB commented that MDDC had asked how more opportunity areas could be taken into consideration as risk of information not being captured. SJ asked that if any information seems incorrect then needs to be raised with Natural England. Must be a joined up approach. Discussions continued about planning/house building and how this LNRS impacts planning decisions. SJ directed us to the supporting information on the website and to read the Planning paper. Devon Local Nature Recovery Strategy (LNRS) | Devon County Council **Item 4 National Landscape Team** TY gave an overview of the Team report and explained that Defra core funding is in place until ΤY 31/03/2026, after this date, we don't know what we will be getting. Defra gives us about 200k which equates to about 10% of our turnover which now sits at 2 million. Levelling up and regeneration Act is still in place but rumours are that this could be reviewed. Blackdown Hills National Landscape team currently stands at 11, with 2 recent young team members joining. Management plan is now live on our website. TY showed the meeting the Projects map and this will be circulated with these minutes. Action: Circulate Projects map from presentation. DW BN commented about the large budget that we are currently working with and the need to closely continue to manage this from a Risk Management perspective. Financial summary – TY confirmed that we are working on a balanced budget

ITEM 5 Terms of Reference (ToR)	
BN asked are we doing what we should be doing? JF commented that he thinks we need more reporting on what is going on, like Vanessa's presentation, very informative. BN replied that we often have 2 guests per meeting to present. JF commented that even if it was short videos to circulate, explained that he uses You Tube to promote the work he is doing. CG commented that not everyone has the equipment/ experience to create videos, but may help if we had equipment we could loan out (microphone/ portable camera) and/or run a workshop to help technical skills. Discussion continued about promoting the Blackdown Hills National Landscape, DL suggested a promotional video that could be shared/ played at events. NB commented that she had seen the new visitor guide and it's in Culmstock stores.	
BN commented about the general attendance at the PMG meetings and the need for someone to be sent as a replacement if you are unable to attend.

ITEM 6 National Landscape Partnership – briefings from Partners	
DNW talked about currently working with Forestry England and the Reptile and amphibian group, looking at the Adder population as it is thought to have declined. Last survey was completed in 2019, early Spring 2026 this will be completed again to see if the suggestion of a decline in numbers is accurate.	ALL
GF talked about his involvement with the Rivers Run Through us project and had a great meeting with all the artists, was great to pull together the creative thinking to share with the RRTU project.	
SJ commented again about the LNRS and asked for case studies that could be shared. SJ confirmed she would be leaving DCC in January 2026, 2 new posts have been created and are currently advertised. BN thanked SJ for all her support and ion particular the great work completed for the LNRS.	
SD added if anything he feels relevant comes up from the Somerset LNRS then he will share this with us. Somerset have recently taken on 2 new graduates and will bring them along to a future meeting to meet everyone.	
JF nothing to add.	
VDH nothing to add.	
NB discussed Rural Hierarchy, and said that it is in early discussions but for everyone to be aware that it relates to a mechanism for delivering houses, by dispensing houses to local communities

based on areas that potentially wouldn't have had new housing before and also could affect the Mid Devon focused areas like Tiverton/ Cullompton. It is currently all under discussion but is worth being aware of.	
GL commented about East Devon District Council's sustainability ruling, where certain areas have been ruled as unsustainable.	
YL commented that 2/3rds of EDDC area covered by National Landscapes (Blackdown Hills and East Devon NLs).	
CD mentioned a number of projects that she is currently working on, one being a Biochar workshop with the mare and foal sanctuary to try and avoid pollution from dung heaps and looking at a project which will make biochar from cow manure.	
DL said that 'Hunt the Heat' project is going strong with 4-5 Parishes signed up so far, this involves a infra-red camera being used to see what heat is being lost from someone's home. Also been doing some water quality monitoring in Broadhembury, quite happy to come out and demonstrate, and get involved with this. RRTU lent DL a microscope and ran a workshop at Denningsdown Farm, which was fantastic, a real asset. Also keen to do a survey in the Axe catchment.	
PL commented that they are waiting for Defra Ministers to confirm the priorities to see where money will be directed, and explained that lots are very reliant on the outcomes.
